

CASL MEETING MINUTES

MONDAY, MAY 7, 2012

Rich Janosky, President, called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM, at the Dover Area Intermediate School Library. President Janosky presented the agenda which is attached to these minutes. He announced there was a quorum present.

The first item on the agenda was the Secretary's Report. President Janosky presented the minutes for the meeting that was held on September 19, 2011. Upon motion, as seconded, the minutes were approved. He also distributed the current CASL Membership Roster requesting changes be noted for coaches and representatives.

The next item on the agenda was the Treasurer's Report presented by Treasurer Patty Neidigh. Patty reviewed the Treasurer's Report, which is attached to the minutes, for the period from September 20, 2011, through May 7, 2012. She noted income from sale of All-Star programs of \$1,104.00, and total expenses of \$1,622.66, for the ending balance of \$15,895.54. Upon motion, as seconded, the Treasurer's Report was approved. Patty then noted registration for each swimmer is \$5.00 and that checks must be payable to CASL and delivered to Patty Neidigh, CASL Treasurer, 2785 Cainbridge Road, York, PA 17402, to be received by Friday, June 8, 2012.

President Janosky then noted that team rosters must be sent to Secretary Jeff Boswell, Patty Neidigh, and to Guy Tanguay, by email, to be received by Friday, June 8, 2012. It was noted that a late fee of \$50.00 would be imposed upon a team for late delivery of the roster or registration payment. President Janosky noted that both roster and registration payment must be received, as noted, by Friday, June 8, 2012.

The next item on the agenda concerned the summer schedule, as explained by Guy Tanguay. Guy reviewed details concerning dual meet setup and dual meet scores reporting. Teams should contact each other prior to their dual meet to double check warm up/meet times, and entry procedures. Teams must double check meet start times and number of lanes to be scored as posted on the CASL Team Roster. There are no changes to start times or number of lanes once the season begins without prior mutual agreement. All teams are REQUIRED to send their Hy-Teck meet back file to Mike Gobrecht at mike@allstarwebs.com and Guy Tanguay at guy.tanguay@gmail.com. All teams are REQUIRED to send their dual meet scores (age group and total) to Mike Gobrecht at mike@allstarwebs.com and Guy Tanguay at guy.tanguay@gmail.com. Both files must be sent by Sunday @ 12:00 noon following your dual meet! LATE FEE: \$25.00 per incident/meet. Guy emphasized that the home team is responsible for calling the visiting team coach before each dual meet to review any necessary details such as event entries and warmup times.

Concerning Invitational Meets, information was distributed for the Carlisle Swim Club Invitational to be held on July 3, 2012.

Concerning Divisional Meets, the AAA Division will be hosted by Spring Grove and that the A Division will be hosted by Shippensburg, to be held at Big Spring. Guy noted that the seeding meeting will be held at the Crimson Frog Coffee House immediately after the Divisional Meets. The Mid-Cap Championship Committee Meeting minutes for the meeting held on September 26, 2011, were distributed. A copy of these minutes are attached. Rich Howley noted that the next Mid-Cap meeting will be held on May 14, 2012, at 7:00 PM, at Cumberland Valley High School.

Concerning awards, it was noted that Divisional awards would be ribbons for 1st through 8th places. All-Star awards will include metals for 1st through 8th places, rosette ribbons for 9th through 16th places, and swim caps for 1st place winners.

The next item on the agenda concerned rules interpretation, as presented by Patty Neidigh. She noted that the league generally follows high school federation rules. She noted the importance of each meet using a PIAA, YMCA, or US swimming certified official. A swimmer can move up one or two age groups during the meet. Roster changes can be done only with a 24 hour notice to Patty, Guy, and Jeff. An 8 and under swimmer can swim a maximum of three events, which can be three individual events. A swimmer in age groups 10 and under and older can swim a maximum of four events, including three individual events. However, in championship meets, a swimmer in any age group can swim a maximum of three events which can be three individual events. 8 and under swimmers get one false start without being disqualified. On relays, the 2nd and 4th swimmer must start in the water with one foot on the wall. League rules require that each dual meet event can have only one exhibition heat unless mutually agreed upon by the coaches who should make an effort to fill all lanes rather than running additional heats. Home teams will use odd lanes in all dual meets. Concerning officials, she noted that officials should wear blue pants and white shirts, must immediately inform the coach of a disqualification and write the disqualification reason on the DQ card. She noted that championship meet entries for relays must list all swimmers, including alternates, and that "B" relays are not automatic entries as alternates for "A" relays. She noted a change in the swimsuit rule, noting that jammers must end above the knee, swimsuits must have no zipper, can't cover the neck, and that team identifications must be silk screened and be no larger than 9 square inches.

There was no old business. Concerning new business, there was a discussion in scheduling of home/away meets for teams who do not change divisions. By consensus, it was agreed that Divisional information must be sent by June 23 with entries due by Sunday at 7:00 PM prior to the meet, with entries sent to the Divisional host, which will send "psych" sheets to each Divisional team by Monday at 7:00 PM so corrections can be then given by each team to the host by Tuesday at 7:00 PM. Then, the host can send the corrected "psych" sheets to Guy and to Mike Gobrecht for posting on the

website. It was noted that All-Star information will be sent by June 23. There was discussion about a dual meet forfeit as raised by the Athletic Club of York, which would need to travel 1 hour 25 minutes to Shippensburg. By consensus, it was agreed that swimmers entered for the non-forfeiting team would be credited for the meet, based on the entries, but swimmers for the forfeiting team will not be credited for the meet. It was also decided that the A Division teams would meet after the meeting to discuss the A Division dual meet schedule and then will inform Guy of its discussion and decisions. There was discussion concerning a "declared false start." Upon motion made, seconded, and carried, it was determined that in the event of a "declared false start," the swimmer and the coach prior to the event must approach the meet referee, who would then determine the "declared false start" with the assigned lane to be empty for that event.

There being no further business, the next meeting was called for Monday, May 6, 2013. Upon motion made, as seconded, the meeting was adjourned at 8:08 PM.
